Report on Talent Next Training Program Conducted At Wipro, Electronic City

The program began on 9th of Jan 2017, attended ▲ by Prof. Govindaraj M, Prof. Vishwanatha C R, Prof. S. N. Kavitha. On day 1, Engineering Attributes was the topic for discussion handled by Dr. Satish kumar. In the session, we understood towards bringing innovation into the classrooms by using alternate teaching-learning methodologies and implementing active learning. They emphasized on having storytelling, brainstorming, demonstration, experimentation, analogy, problem-solving, group activity and case study in the classes. The day 2 was the start of the MILE-1 program. We had two mentors Mr. Avinash Patel and Mrs. Anitha who continued till the completion of the program. The session had hands on expertise on various OOPS concepts, Exception handling and an introduction to collections. As all participants could not coup up with the concepts, the topics continued for the next day also. After that there was a hands-on experiments on the concepts learnt in the form of mini projects. The day 3 continued later by introducing us to MILE-3 which had Junit, IO, JDBC followed by an assessment project and MCQs on the 4th day. The day 5 was the start of MILE-3 which focused on concepts like HTML, CSS, JAVASCRIPT, BootStrap and Servlets followed by hands-on mini

project. On day 6, the topics covered were JSP, AJAX and various concepts on web programming followed by a project assessment and MCQs. That was the end of our 1st week of training. In the second week, the focus was on getting us some sort of training in the form mini projects. We were given hands-on experience on solving a problem statement. The day 7 and 8 went with that only. On day 9, we learnt how to carry out unit testing on our



projects. Then day 10, 11 and 12 we had hands-on training on Hibernate and Springs. The training on Hibernate and Springs was totally new to us. We learnt many concepts on these two topics. Today the two biggest challenges for Enterprise

Web Development are to managing multiple Http requests and managing data with databases. One of the most successful solution for solving the above

said problem is Model-View-Controller (MVC Model). So there was lot of emphasize on making us understand what is MVC model is all about and how to do it practically. In JDBC, creating beans and managing the JDBC connection process is complicated and became mechanical work. In order to address this issue, automation of the data handling is most essential thing for real time applications. The Technology Framework evolved to address this is Hibernate. Hibernate Framework can be used to automate the Bean-JDBC process using 2 approaches, one using Xml file for mapping bean to database and another one using annotation. Basics of Hibernate framework covered and able to solve simple programs for One to One Relationship, One to Many Relation, Many to One and Many to Many Relationship. The last topic of discussion on 21st Jan 2017 was Spring Framework. This Framework simplifies the handling Multiple Http requests. Each spring framework internally converted into servlet. It helps for faster web development. We are able to understand the need of Spring and able to execute simple programs using Spring framework. After learning all these concepts, the training ended with a valedictory event on 21st Jan 2016 and all participants were given certificates.

For Students looking for Placements/IT- Career, Make Your resume Hit by these 11 Actions

1. Replace the objective statement.

"Replace the objective statement at the top of your résumé with a branded headline that conveys your value to the reader, i.e., 'Registered nurse committed to providing safe, effective patient care," says Laurie Berenson, certified master résumé writer and founder of Sterling Career Concepts LLC.

2. Connect with your network.

"Connect with one person from your network with whom you haven't spoken in at least one month," Berenson advises. "Pick up the phone, too — don't rely on emailing."

3. Update your social profiles.

"Update your LinkedIn profile content for two reasons: First, to keep it current, but also so the activity puts your name in front of every one of your contacts as a network update on their home page," Berenson says.

4. Conduct research.

"A lack of basic understanding of the agency's mission and/or philosophy shows a lack of preparation and interest," says Natasha R.W. Eldridge, founding partner and director of human resources for Eldridge Overton Educational Programs.

5. Make your voicemail more professional.

"Remove ringtones and silly voicemail recordings from voicemail," Eldridge says. "I am not going to leave a professional message on the voicemail of an applicant that has music blasting as a ringtone. It shows me that job searching is not a priority."

6. Prepare for the interview.

"Preparation is everything," says Bruce A. Hurwitz, president and CEO of Hurwitz Strategic Staffing Ltd. "Make up a list of the questions you do not want to be asked; then answer them in the company of a friend. Tell the friend you want honest feedback to make certain that you are giving confident, credible and professional-sounding answers. Once you are comfortable with the difficult questions ... you will be more than prepared for the 'easy' questions."

7. Join industry associations.

. "Contact and join a local professional association," says Raina Kropp, HR talent partner at Vistage International. "Sometimes you can get student or intransition discounts. Don't be afraid to ask. These are the people you want to network with since they could be your future manager or colleague."

8. Clean up your résumé.

"Remove irrelevant experience from your résumé," says Katie Niekrash, senior managing director of the recruitment firm Execu-Search. "While the summer after college that you spent scooping ice cream may have been the best [time] of your life, it doesn't really apply to a career in finance. Pick and choose your relevant experience, and tailor it to the job you're applying for."

9. Get your references ready.

"Prepare your list of references before the interview," Niekrash says. "Once you have confirmed your two to three references, create a simple document that lists all the relevant information the employer would need to know about them — name, title, contact info., etc. Bring this document with you to all your interviews, so this way, if the hiring manager asks you for your references, you'll be prepared and look organized."

10. Stay organized.

"Create a master list for all the jobs you apply for. The key to a successful job search is organization," Niekrash says. "To do this, create an Excel spreadsheet that contains a row for each job you apply for, and include these columns: the date you applied; the company; the contact; the position for which you applied; how you applied; if, when and with whom you interviewed; when you should next follow up or what your next steps are; and the current status of the application. Creating this document should only take a few minutes, and updating it as you proactively apply for jobs should only take a few seconds."

Q1. Find the angle between the hour hand and minute hand of a clock when the time is 05:30?

A. 20° B. 15°

C. 17° D. 25°

Answer- Option B

Explanation-

At 5 o'clock, the hour hand is at 150° from the vertical.

In 30 minutes, angle made by hour hand = $150^{\circ} + 30 \times 0.5 = 165^{\circ}$

Angle made by minute hand = $6x30 = 180^{\circ}$

So, angle between the hour hand and minute hand = $180 - 165 = 15^{\circ}$

Q2. What is the reflex angle between the minute hand and hour hand at 08:45?

A. 356°B. 354.5°

C. 352.5° D. 350°

Answer- Option C

Explanation-

At 8 o'clock, the hour hand is at 240° from the vertical.

In 45 minutes, angle made by hour hand = $240^{\circ} + 45 \times 0.5 = 262.5^{\circ}$

Angle made by minute hand = $6x45 = 270^{\circ}$

Angle between the hour hand and minute hand = $270 - 262.5 = 7.5^{\circ}$

So, reflex angle is $360 - 7.5 = 352.5^{\circ}$

Q3. At 10:40, the angle between hour hand and minute hand is

A. 80° B. 85°

C. 90° D. 75°

Answer- Option A

Explanation-

At 10 o'clock, the hour hand is at 300° with the vertical.

In 40 minutes, angle made by hour hand = $300^{\circ} + 40 \times 0.5 = 320^{\circ}$

Angle made by minute hand = $6x40 = 240^{\circ}$

So, angle between the hour hand and minute hand = $320 - 240 = 80^{\circ}$

Q4. What is the angle formed by the minute hand and hour hand at 09:25?

A. 40° B. 43.5°

C. 45° D. 42.5°

Answer- Option D

Explanation-

At 9 o'clock, the hour hand is at 180° with the vertical.

In 25 minutes, angle made by hour hand = $180^{\circ} + 25 \times 0.5 = 192.5^{\circ}$

Angle made by minute hand = $6x25 = 150^{\circ}$

So, angle between the hour hand and minute hand = $192.5 - 150 = 42.5^{\circ}$

Q5. A faulty clock gains 6 seconds in 10 minutes, and it is set right at 9 AM. What is the correct time when the clock is at 11 PM?

A. 10:51:36 PM B. 10:51:24 PM C. 10:52:36 PM D. 10:52:24 PM

Answer- Option A

Explanation-

A clock gains 6 sec. in 10 min. So, in 1 hour, it gains 36 sec. From 9 AM to 11 PM, time passed is 14 hours. In 14 hours, the clock has gained 36x14 = 504 sec. At 11 PM, the correct time is 10:51:36 PM


